Six students have been hounored by the Rotary Club as Tytherington School Students of the Term. The criteria for the awards is engagement in the local community. The winners were as follows (left to right in picture): Maddy Blunn (Year 10), Honor Rowlands (Year 9), Diego Fryer (6th Form), Esther Bird (Year 7), James Bridge (Year 11) and Will Nettle (Year 8). The awards were presented by John Sherwood, Chair of Youth Service Committee and President, Keith Dobson.

All of the recipients have been involved in some form of community charity project. Esther Bird in Year 7 is a key member of the school charity committee. Will Nettle had the idea to run the Macclesfield 5K as part of a team raising money for an automatic external defibrillator for his old primary school (Puss Bank). He was the first finisher for the

team and they raised £300. Honor Rowlands in Year 9 organised a number of school events to raise in excess of £2,500 for the fantastic charity, 'Once Upon a Smile'. Amongst several other things, Maddy in Year 10 was a driving force behind the organisation of the Tytherington's Grandparents Day. Outside of school, James Bridge in Year 11 is a dedicated member of the Cadets. Within this organisation he freely volunteers his time to help raise money for charity through activities such as sponsored runs and bag packs. #### YEAR 11 ESFA PREMIER LEAGUE CUP BY MR FITZSIMMONS



Year 11 continued on their impressive English Schools Premier League Cup run beating one of the favourites Wright Robinson 5-4 on penalties after the match finished 4-4 after extra time. Wright Robinson is a large secondary school from Gorton, Manchester. The match was a clash of two footballing styles with the visitors used to playing on large 4G pitches with a snooker table evenness that allows for skill, flair and expression. The Tytherington pitch is small, muddy and ploughed and tends to suit a more 'Dogs of War' approach made famous by Joe Royle's Everton in the mid 1990s where organisation, industrious work rate and controlled aggression are key. The boys played

fantastically well throughout the game coming from behind throughout the match to force extra time and then penalties. Out of the first five penalties taken both schools missed one penalty resulting in sudden death. Wright Robinson missed the first kick and Ben Stanier showed composure and nerves of steel to slot home the winning kick. In round 7 we are again at home against Manchester Grammar School. This is the furthest we have got in an ESFA competition since the 6<sup>th</sup> form reached the semi-final way back in 2007.


