LONDON AND RIO GOLD MEDALLIST VISITS TYTHERINGTON SCHOOL



Last Thursday we were delighted to welcome Pamela Relph (MBE), who is a double Paralympic Champion, 4x World Rowing Champion, World Record holder and remains undefeated in international competition. Pamela spent an hour talking to a group of 50 Year 9 students about how sport enabled her to overcome her disability. The students discovered how her experiences growing up with Psoriatic Arthritis and also as an officer in the army allowed her to overcome adversity. Pamela spoke in detail to the students about how she worked as a team to win her numerous gold medals and about performing under pressure.

The students had the chance to see her gold medals and also ask her questions about her sporting achievements and also her personal story. Pamela's recent success at the Rio 2016 Paralympic Games makes her the most decorated Paralympic rower ever, being the only athlete in the world to have won 2 Paralympic Golds.

GERMAN STUDENTS GET A TASTE OF LIFE AT TYTHERINGTON SCHOOL

Last Tuesday we were delighted to welcome colleagues and students from Rechberg Gymnasium in Donzdorf, Germany. 53 students and 4 teachers arrived bright and early on Tuesday morning to a welcome by Mr Botwe and Miss Roe (Head of MFL). In tough conditions, at Whitwell UKWA National Windsurfing Open Cup Series, Whitwell 2017, Roan achieved 2nd place.

During Zone Squad Easter Camp, Roan moved up from a 4.5m sail to a 5.8m sail. This was a bold self set challenge as this was his first experience sailing on the sea. Roan completed a 12K round trip sailing to Weymouth for an ice cream and back, as well as an intense few days of racing drill tactics. He received the RYA National Zone Easter Award for most improved sailor. Well done!



