POETRY AT TYTHERINGTON

In January of last year, a group of Year 10 Advanced Learners worked with the former Cheshire East Poet Laureate, John Lindley, to produce a range of poetry based on the issue of conscription. The project was launched by the East Cheshire Quaker Society along with john Lindley, who conducted poetry workshops in a number of schools across Macclesfield.

The outcome of the project is an anthology of poems written by Macclesfield students, many of them from Tytherington. The anthology is entitled "*Worn With Pride*" and it contains poems on the theme of war and its consequences. Our students had their poetry displayed in Macclesfield Library last February. On November 29th, a celebration evening was held at All Hallows Catholic College to launch the poetry anthology. At this event, a number of students form local schools read some of their poems to an invited audience of parents and teachers.

Our school was excellently represented by Emily Griffen, who read her powerful and thoughtful poem entitled "Peace?" and Joanna Stephen who read her thought-provoking and defiant poem entitled "I'm Strong, Not Afraid". Both girls read their poems clearly and confidently, and were a credit to the school. John Lindley also read a poem by Harriet Terrington entitled "When I Went To War", because he felt it encapsulated many of the key themes and ideas of the collection and should definitely be included in the readings!

The evening culminated in the performance of a special piece of music, written by Taylor Giacomo and performed by a group of young singers. The piece was based on the poems in the anthology and was called "*Cowards*". The poems included in this piece of music were mostly written by Tytherington students, and included work Vicky Wilson, Layla Sipi, Ben Maw and Brian McClintock, whose poem, "*Cowards*", gave the piece its title.

Our Advanced Learners have shown great talent and hard work to produce these poems, and will each receive their own complimentary copy of the anthology which they can place with pride on their bookshelves!

There will also be a copy in the school library for anyone who would like to read these fantastic poems.
