OPPORTUNITY FOR YEAR 12 STUDENTS ASPIRING TO STUDY LAW

Senior Partner at Kingsley Napley, an internationally renowned Law Firm, inviting Tytherington Y12 students to take part in a brilliant competition which is being run in conjunction with The Times Newspaper.

Students work in small teams of 2-4, completing a series of tasks typically dealt with by solicitors. They also provide legal advice for virtual clients. This is all done via Kingsley Napley's website.

The aim is to give them first-hand experience of what it is like to be a solicitor. Taking part would also look very good on University and job applications.

There are various stages, starting in January 2019 and the final will be in June 2019 at the Times Headquarters. If students reach the final, accommodation & travel are all paid for by the firm.

Winning team receives - £5000 for their school, £500 for each student in the team, A weeks work experience at Kingsley Napley, the opportunity to interview with them for a Legal Apprenticeship (6-year study and employment leading to qualification as a solicitor), Even if they don't secure the apprenticeship, runners up receive 3 months paid employment at the firm.
