Personal Tutoring

The role of the Sixth Form Tutor is crucial in ensuring that all students achieve, are happy and fully prepared for life at university or in the world of work. Every student is allocated a personal tutor when joining the Sixth Form and their role is to guide individual students through the academic and social hurdles that face all students as they prepare for examinations, independent living and the world of work.

Where possible, students will have a tutor whose subject specialism is similar to their own in order that they are able to offer study support and provide expert advice on university and job applications. Students will usually remain with the same tutor throughout their time in the Sixth Form.

Sixth Form students meet in Tutor Groups or for a formal assembly weekly. This time is spent offering advice and support on self-organisation and study, as well as providing information and discussion opportunities on issues that affect young adults. Such presentations may include mental health care, safe driving, alcohol/drug awareness and stress management.

Guided by regular Monitoring Reports produced by subject teachers, these tutor sessions allow tutors to monitor student progress and set appropriate targets. They are also used to advise students on how best to use their study time, to provide guidance on gaining work experience placements and making university applications, and to support students with any personal issues.

The role of the tutor is crucial to every student's success at Tytherington Sixth Form. Where academic monitoring and pastoral care are provided by one tutor, individual students are understood holistically and personalised guidance can be offered.

Enrichment

Life in Sixth Form encompasses more than academic study. Our students are offered a range of opportunities and experiences to complement and enrich their academic work, allowing them to develop the qualities and skills for personal growth and to enhance their prospects in employment and Higher Education.

Tytherington School has an extensive range of extra-curricular activities and Sixth Form students are an intrinsic part of their success. Students can continue to pursue their interests in sport, drama, music and community action. In addition, students are expected to make use of some of their study periods to participate in activities to broaden their experiences and interests. Students may spend time on activities organised independently or those organised by our specialist staff. Students may, to name but a few, choose to challenge their

preconceptions in Philosophy and Politics discussions; set up their own limited company in the highly successful Young Enterprise scheme; enhance their leadership and communication skills by striving for the Gold Duke of Edinburgh Award; or simply let off steam on the football or hockey pitch.

The Sixth Form experience is also enhanced through a number of Enrichment Days held throughout the school year. These days aim to provide students with information and experiences that are directly relevant to young adults. Covering areas such as healthy lifestyles, career opportunities, stress management, staying safe on the road and budget management. Enrichment Days aim to help prepare our students for the challenges and pleasures of independent living.

Choosing a Programme of Study

Students should take account of a number of factors when making decisions about which courses to study in the Sixth Form. They should:

- Choose subjects that they enjoy and can succeed in.
- Think carefully about the advice of their teachers, tutors and careers advisers.
- Think about the assessment methods of the courses they choose.
- Consider which subjects complement each other in terms of both content and skills.
- Look carefully at the entry requirements of the courses they wish to study and ensure that they meet them.
- Research the requirements of universities and employers Universities often specify required and preferred qualifications for entry onto their degree courses.

Students at Tytherington Sixth Form follow a Linear two-year programme of study. Students should apply for 4 subjects, 4 subjects plus AS Core Maths or 4 subjects plus an Enrichment AS subject. Please refer to our [course information booklet](#) for further details.

This is to support students to make an informed choice about their study programme. Then, during our 'right-choices' process in the first half-term, students will be supported to confirm their study programme.

A small number may choose to continue to study four and would be expected to achieve predominantly grades 8/9 at GCSE to do so. This fourth subject may be one of our 'enrichment' AS Subjects, which are studied over a 2-year period.

In addition to timetabled lessons, students are expected to spend at least four additional hours per subject per week studying independently and students will have study periods allocated on their timetable for private study within the school day. There are quiet Sixth Form only study areas to support this independent work. On rare occasions it is necessary to allocate a teaching period after school in order to allow for a broad curriculum choice. Where this is the case students receive an additional study period within the school week.

Destinations

Students who have completed their Sixth Form studies at Tytherington progress on to Higher Education, Apprenticeships and Employment.

On average 85% of students will continue their students at a range of universities across the country, with approximately a third of applicants securing places at the most prestigious Russell Group universities. We have a long tradition of supporting our most able students in gaining places at both Oxford and Cambridge universities and in the highly competitive fields of Medicine, Dentistry and Veterinary Science.

The courses chosen by our students range from the traditional - English, Mathematics, History - to the modern and vocational - Aviation Studies, Fashion, Sport Management. Sciences and Engineering are well represented, as are Languages, Nursing and Business.

Our students spread their wings, some moving as far away from Macclesfield as Plymouth, London and Glasgow; some as close to home as Stafford, Manchester and Keele.

Tytherington also provides support for those students wishing to gain Higher or Degree Apprenticeships or employment following completion of their studies. We have developed close working links with companies such as AstraZeneca and Barclays amongst others vis the Macclesfield Pledge, with our students gaining highly sought after work-based training.

Induction Activities - July


A programme of induction activities are published and arranged to support student transition into Key Stage 5.


